Planning and development

- Granting of first tranche of houses on WWHR
 - Leigh Day solicitors engaged to provide advice
 - Unlikely to have sufficient grounds to challenge
 - Aerial survey undertaken July 2018
 - 129 of 425 houses approved July 2018
 - Crest Nicholson have been invited to engage with RA
- University
 - Passing of "Hybrid Plan" despite objections on 1030 new car parking places

Crime and security

- Highlights
 - 24 Streetwatch volunteers trained
 - Patrols becoming regular
 - Social benefits
 - Thank you to Louise Hughes for coordinating
 - WhatsApp pilot "Broadwells Watch"
 - 52 participants; several suspicious events tracked, one 999 call, several lost animals found
 - Recommended for other streets (Streetwatch leaders?)
 - Commercial security pilot being assessed
 - Slow, complicated and fraught with risk; in progress
 - Regular meeting with local police scheduled by councillors

Traffic

- Parking restrictions
 - Some introduced to deter University parking
- Speed Watch
 - Initial speed-monitoring sessions run with police
 - Run by community volunteers with PCSOs
- Speed Limits
 - Discussions opened with council on speed limit
 - Assessment of case for 30mph limit on WWHR
