Crime and Security

- Police figures show that overall crime is reducing (comparative year to year)
- However, resident perception is an increase, and more brazen in approach
- NB "Burglary" statistics do not include the more serious offence of "Robbery" (1 incident)
- Potential to deter crime in the area:
 - "Streetwatch" self help
 - Commercial Security patrols



Streetwatch



- Police sanctioned and trained
- 16 volunteers trained so far
- 8 Patrols completed
- Commitment is 2 hours per month
 - Should equate to approx 4 patrols / week
- Patrols are in pairs (or 3 in the evening)
 - Initially with PCSO support
- You can take non-dangerous dogs
- Louise Hughes acting as co-ordinator




Streetwatch Initial Feedback



- Very positive reaction from the community
- Very positive volunteer response – very sociable
- Need to find ways to make scheduling easier and keep up momentum
- Further volunteers welcome

Incident Reporting pilot (WhatsApp)



- Instant messaging group on WhatsApp
- Set up in a small area of Broadwells initially
 - Expanding to cover other tributaries
- Rapid alert of suspicious activity
- One 999 call as a result

Incident Reporting Pilot feedback

- Works well for relatively small groups
- Exposes mobile numbers of all participants and unwieldy with very large groups

Proposal:

- WhatsApp groups set up for each logical grouping of streets
- 1 or 2 members from each group also invited to all the other groups
- (Alternative is to use another App e.g. Telegram)

Commercial Security Patrols

- Based on a successful pilot in Sutton Coldfield
- Their scheme: (Innovate security)
 - Patrols on 3 (random) days, 3 patrols / day
 - Approx £25/patrol
 - Area smaller than WW Heath, single entrance
- Visible deterrent with signage, van and possible foot patrols
- No reported burglaries since in operation

Commercial Security - Survey response

- Approx 12% of households responded
 - Mostly positive
- Much higher response rate at the eastern (lower) end of WWH Road
- Comments
 - Target at daytime rather than overnight
 - "We shouldn't need to do this"
 - All the community benefit even if they don't pay
 - High value cars seem to be prime target

Commercial Security Discussion

- Not viable across all of WW Heath on current response levels
- Question:
 - Do we need this if Streetwatch is successful?
- Proposal:
 - Fixed length pilot over 2-3 months to assess viability
 - Focus on area down from Network Rail (higher uptake from survey)
 - Fix at £5 / week and flex number of patrols to amount of funding
 - Move bias of patrols to daytime
 - Link in with Streetwatch to fill gaps

Commercial Security – Next Steps

- If we proceed:
- Define scope of service and contractual commitments
- Establish means of contracting through RA or direct with providers
- Establish firm commitment from households
